Program Description:

Professionals in this field have day-to-day tasks such as installing switches, routers, and firewall devices, running computer cable drops to allow network connectivity, troubleshooting wireless and wired communications throughout a company, and finally, securing a company through all aspects of security such as physical, organizational, and technological. Professional titles are often Network Associate or Network Administrator. Jobs in this area start around \$35,000-\$40,000 dollars based on certifications attained and experience in field.

Notes:

1. Students who do not have a minimum of 18 on the ACT or 480 on the SAT for English will be required to take ENL 095 along with ENL 111.

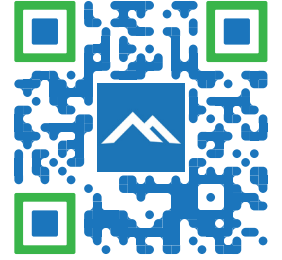
2. IT 270 - This course prepares students to sit for the CompTIA A+ certification.
