On December 17 and 18, the Assessment Committee will be hosting its first ever “Assessment Bootcamp.” Covering topics ranging from vocabulary and types of assessment to future HLC accreditation changes, this two-day, intensive in-service session will provide faculty with the information and resources to excel in their future assessment endeavors.
